- I would like this board to be included in any traveling exhibits and will collect when notified.

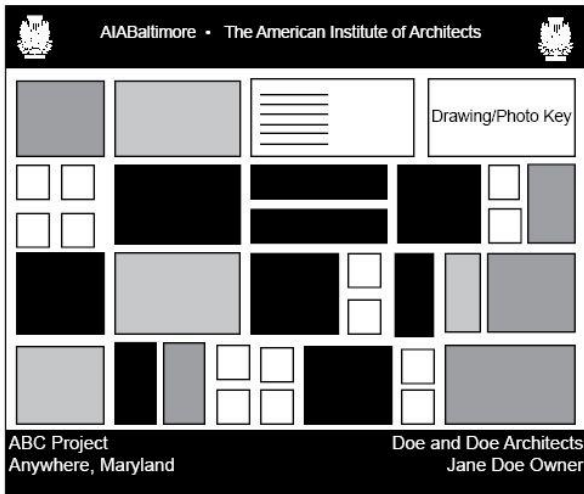
BOARD FORMAT SUGGESTED GUIDELINES

The AIA Health & Wellness Committee wants this to be an opportunity for firms to celebrate their commitment to building healthy communities. Please present your work in the way you best see fit. Below are some suggestions for what to include on your boards and how.

Each board may include:

- a. Brief description of how the project represents healthy design.
- b. Photographs, renderings, floor plans, Site plans etc.
- c. Project name and location in the title block.
- d. Submitting Firm Name, Project Architectural Firm and Project name in the title block
- e. Photographer credits.

Board Material: White foam core (no gator board) Length – 36 “; Width – 36 “; Thickness – 3/16 “

Bands

TITLE BAND – 2 “ HIGH; 48 point Architype Bold (or Arial), white letters.

BODY BAND – 30 “ HIGH; 14-point Architype (or Arial)

IDENTIFICATION BAND – 4 “ HIGH

60-point Architype Bold (or Arial), white letters.

Include project name and location. Opposite, include entrant's name and owner name.

Additional line may be used if needed to properly credit all key members of design/construction team.
